

Instructions for Artists Submitting Poetry-Inspired Art

For a Juried Exhibit September 16-29, 2017
at the Washburn Cultural Center, Washburn, Wisconsin



1. Select one poem from the three poems provided for interpretation (see separate documents)
 - a. [Somewhere Everything Old is Dying by Karla Huston](#)
 - b. [Theory of Lipstick by Karla Huston](#)
 - c. [Tough Like the Tansy by Howard Paap](#)
2. Create an artistic expression of the poem or part of the poem
3. Please do not sign the art until after the piece has been juried
4. **Submit a good resolution digital photograph (jpg) of the art by email to the Bayfield Library by September 1, 2017: artfrompoetryBCL@gmail.com**
5. Up to three entries per person
6. No membership or geographic restrictions on who may enter; students over age 16
7. Email entry must include the following information:
Name, Home Town, Title of Art, Title of Poem, Medium, Dimensions, Value or NFS, Attached File named with Last Name_First Name_Title (this will be coded by number for jurying to remain anonymous)
8. Art can be of any visual medium (e.g., painting, fiber, quilt, jewelry, sculpture)
9. Art pieces can be for sale (30 percent goes to Washburn Cultural Center)
10. If selected for show (limited gallery space), bring the art ready for hanging or display September 9, 12, or 13 (deadline September 13) to the WCC during open hours (11-4)
11. There is no entry fee to submit or required for selected exhibitors, but donations to the Bayfield Library are welcome and appreciated
12. Mark your calendar for
 - Reception and poetry reading, 6-9 pm September 29, Washburn Cultural Center
Reading of the three poems and poetry program by Karla Huston, 7:00 p.m.
 - Poetry Workshop with Karla Huston, 10:00 am September 30, Bayfield Carnegie Library
13. Artists may take home unsold art at the close of the program September 29
